The end of the year is fast approaching and that means it will soon be time to nominate the Couple of the Year and the Individual of the Year. We will be taking nominations at the November and December meetings. We are starting the process earlier this year and ask that you only submit one nomination for each position per person. Once nominations are received, the selection process begins and we will be announcing the 2009 Couple of the Year and Individual of the Year at the Holiday Party on Saturday, December 20th.

For those of you who are new to Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA), here is the official information regarding the Couple of the Year program. The Couple of the Year (COY) program was established in 1988 to recognize couples for their dedication, accomplishments, and participation; couples who typify the GWRRA image of "fun, safety and knowledge". Each year couples are honored by being selected as Chapter, District, Region, and International COYs. COYs are active and enthusiastic about GWRRA and committed to GWRRA ideals. COYs promote GWRRA both within the Association (helping with retention) and outside the Association (helping to attract new Members into the GWRRA "family"). The COY at each level should be a couple that you would be proud to have represent you and the Association.

The requirements are as follows:

- 1. Couple must consist of one male and one female
- 2. They must hold individual or Family Memberships in GWRRA. Memberships must be valid through the term of the Chapter COY position. It is suggested that a couple has completed at least one year membership in the

GWRRA prior to participating in the Chapter Couple of the Year Selection Process. This couple may choose to participate at various levels including district, region and international. Please note that Associate Members are not eligible to participate in the Couple of the Year Program.

The Individual of the Year will have to meet the same criteria as the Couple of the Year. This person can only be honored at the Chapter and District levels. At the present time, the Region and International levels do not have such a program.

Given the information above, please take time in the next few weeks to think of who you would like to nominate.

Remember that immediately following the December meeting, we will have the 2009 Calendar/Ride Planning meeting at the church. Please bring your ideas and a dish to share. The chapter will provide hot dogs, chili, the fixing's, and beverages.

Come prepared with ride ideas, plans, and dates that we will be adding to the calendar for next year. This year in preparing the calendar we will indicate on the calendar who is responsible for organizing the rides. By notating the planning person, it will enable you to contact that person directly to find out the scoop.

Rider Education

How do we get more space at a traffic light? We can't buy it, acquire it, or ask for it. Having space on the road is important to a motorcyclist. But how do we get space at a traffic light. We definitely can't buy it or ask for it. So we must position ourselves at a traffic light to get this space. First of all, when I come to a traffic light and there is a car in front of me, I don't stop on his/ her bumper. I leave at least a car length in front of me so that I can drive off to my escape route. If the driver behind is paying attention he/she will not stop on my tail. In my experience, most of the time they will give me at least a half car length. The next thing I would like to do is



flash my brake lights when the car is approaching. This will signal to the car that I have stopped or going to stopping. (Having a Kisan Tailblazer installed helps). The last thing I would like to do is look in my rearview mirror as the vehicle approaches my motorcycle to ensure that he/she is going to stop. Most of the time they will suspect you and stop at a decent distance, and then other won't. Now what I have just briefly discuss with you is not a *guarantee* that people will give you the space that you want/need. But it is a start in getting the space needed at a traffic light.
