Parking Lot Practice

The weather is getting better and warmer on someday versus others and the motorcycles are coming out of storage. However, how good your riding skills are since the motorcycle has been stored or put away temporally. Have you been riding everyday during the winter? Probably not! If your bike has dust on it, so does your riding skills. Parking Lot Practice (PLP) give you the chance to practice on some of fundamental riding techniques and skills such as braking, cornering and swerving. This is just a regular parking lot set up to improve your riding skills at a self-paced and a non-instructional riding program. This is not a classroom environment, there is on teaching or coaching is involved. The Guide provides some coaching tips for improving the rider's skills and understanding of the techniques involved. This is not a mandatory practice, but it is a good way to brush up on your skills.

Speaking of riding skills, here's some helpful ideas for getting ready for the riding season.

Riders can protect themselves by:

- Preparing yourself for getting back on the motorcycle; know that your skills <u>are not</u> what they were when you put the **bike** in **storage**
- ► Preparing your bike; doing routine maintenance, check for road worthiness
- Preparing your personal safety equipment; make sure you are protected against the unexpected
- Realizing that car drivers <u>are not used to seeing</u> <u>you</u>—they will see you late or not at all
