Muscle Memory!!! What is that? Do I need that?! Where can I get that? Only Practice! Practice! Practice! If you don't practice your motorcycle skills, you will lose them. This is where your muscle memory skill comes into play. By not riding your motorcycle during the winter season, you're riding muscle become stagnant. "How?" You may say? If your favorite sport personality didn't play for six months, didn't exercise, or do anything to stay in shape, will he/she be as sharp as the day they stopped playing. The answer is "No". They will not be at the top of their game because they have not done anything to stay in shape or keep their skill sharp. That's why most athletics do something in the off season. They can still play the game, they didn't forget how to play but they may be a little rusty. They need to exercise their muscles back into working condition.

The same thing goes for riding our motorcycle. We have not forgotten how to ride, but our muscles have not done the motion of riding for a while. When we take an extended period of time off from riding, our muscles get a little slow in the job they need to perform. Now, we don't have to go to the gym to lift weights or run six miles to get in shape. But by practicing our riding skills, this will refresh our riding muscles, refresh us mentally and physically to get us back in riding condition. Even though we may have taken a Motorcycle Safety Foundation Experience Rider Course (ERC) in the past years or so there may be items that we may learn or **re-learn** by taking the class again. You can also practice in and empty parking lot or attend a Parking Lot Practice seminar. By practicing, we all can ride safely and with confidence.

Prizes to be awarded at the January 2011 Chapter meeting. Prizes will be first place \$100, second place \$50, third place \$25 if possible. Gift certificates may have to be substituted for tax reasons, determination pending.
