WASHINGTON D.C. & WING DING 33

Our riding adventure started out this year with a trip to Washington, DC in conjunction with Wing Ding 33 in Knoxville, TN. Since it is a 3 day trip to Washington, DC, Laura decided to fly to the destination. I left on Wednesday, 29 June 2011 and my first stop was Whiteman Air Force Base in Knob Noster, MO. It was about a ten hour ride. After a good night sleep, I left one of my favorite rest stops when traveling on east I-70 to my next stop which was Louisville, KY, about an eight hour day. Pumpkin Bars

2 C flour	
4 eggs	
1/2 tsp salt	

1 tsp baking soda 2 c pumpkin 2 c sugar 2 tsp cinnamon 2 tsp baking powder 1 c oil



Mix all together. Bake on greased cookie sheet for 25 minutes at 350.

Cream Cheese Frosting

3 oz Cream cheese softened	3/4 stick margarine softened
1 tsp vanilla	1 tsp milk
1-3/4 c powdered sugar	

Beat all ingredients together. Very good on pumpkin bars.

Chocolate sheet cake

2 c sugar	1 c water
2 c flour	2 eggs
1/2 tsp salt	1/3 c buttermilk or sour milk
3 Tbsp cocoa	1 tsp soda
1 tsp vanilla	-



Mix in large bowl the sugar, flour, and salt. Melt margarine, cocoa, and water together and bring to a boil. Mix with flour mixture. Add eggs, milk, soda, and vanilla. Mix well. Pour in greased brownie pan. Bake at 375 for 20 minutes. Frost while still hot with the following.

Frosting:

1 stick margarine, 2 Tbsp cocoa, 4-1/2 Tbsp milk. Bring to boil, then add 1 box powdered sugar, 1 tsp vanilla and 1 c nuts.
