RIDER EDUCATION

IT'S BUSY UP THERE!!!

Laura decided to take a motorcycle class to learn how to ride. She took the class and did quite well for very novice rider. A couple weeks later we went home, and she was telling friends about the class. In the midst of the story I heard her say "It's busy up there." She was just in a parking lot riding around. Just think about the busy street traffic. It could be a nightmare for a novice rider. For the experience rider, we make it look all so easy, up shifting, down shifting, braking, cornering, swerving, using S.E.E., using turn signals, high-low beam, knees in, head & chin up, using horn, etc... These actions are muscle memory. We do this all the time to keep ourselves and our passengers safe from harm.

Let's look at the accident that happened on 30 April 2012 in Denver involving a motorcycle that got hit by a red light runner in an automobile. The first two items I noticed in the video were the through lanes had no vehicles in them and the large white vehicle in the left turn lane. I knew something was going to happen, but I didn't know from what direction. As the light changed, the motorcycle was the first vehicle to enter the intersection. If the motorcycle had delayed just a little, the SUV would have been the first vehicle in the intersection. Also, the motorcycle could not see the car due to the obstruction of the white vehicle. Motorcycle riders should use extreme caution when entering the intersection. Motorcycles have a very low profile and can hide behind vehicles very easily. Remember at intersections, all through lanes and turns lanes should have a vehicle in each lane, if possible. Do not try to be the first vehicle through the intersection; it is not worth the cost or life. Try to use other vehicles as shields when going through the intersection. Consider using the time at intersections to investigate your surroundings, who is behind you, are they going to stop, what is across the intersection, what is to the left and right, who is beside you? Take into account of what is around you while stopped at an intersection. You'll be glad you did.
