DRIVING DISTRACTION

Has this ever happened to you?

You go to your vehicle, unlock the door, start the engine, drive off, and 20 minutes later, when you arrive at your destination, you can hardly recall what happened during your ride. If you answer **YES**, then you should really focus on these following questions:

Were you actively tracking traffic and road conditions OR were you focused on other tasks?

Letøs go back to our situation; you may hardly recall what happened during the 20 minute ride from home to work. Yet, perhaps during this ride you were checking directions, enjoying breakfast, using your information system, talking or texting on the phone and doing all of this while navigating through rush hour traffic. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) 2013 report, drivers engaging in visual-manual tasks, such as dialing or texting, increases the risk of being involved in a crash by three times.

YES IF YOU HAVE NOT FIGURED IT OUT YET - DRIVING IS CERTAINLY A DANGEROUS BUSINESS.

Distracted driving is a serious safety challenge for today¢ drivers and puts everyone at risk. This innocent loss of information is known as **"INATTENTIONAL BLINDNESS".** Recent studies have also shown that drivers regularly experience this phenomenon especially when they are engaged in phone conversations. So far, we have all seen/read statistics about distracted driving for example texting and driving. Now, there is emerging consensus amongst scientists and data to prove that even simple activity such as talking on a phone (even hands free) can cause driver¢ performance to diminish. In a AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety 2013 report, researchers found that a driver¢ level of cognitive distraction is about equal when using either hands free or hand -held cell phones. **WHAT IS INATTENTIONAL BLINDNESS?**

Studies from major universities have shown that when you speak on a cell phone (including hands free phone calls), this inattentional blindness occurs. This is a personøs ability to perceive things that are in plain sight because the brain has prioritized and assigned its processing capacity elsewhere. Scientists have already concluded that people have a limited attention capacity. So, as you unintentionally allow your mind to switch priorities from safe operation of a vehicle to some other secondary activity, critical details of your surroundings disappear from your mindøs eye.

So, next time, when you take that call while driving, engrossed in a conversation (even hand free), you may miss many critical safety details. Maybe it a child running into the street chasing a ball, a school bus that stopped in the middle the traffic to pick or drop children or a traffic light turning red.

RIDER EDUCATION

It is not about texting and driving anymore. Every time a person drives and engages in a cell phone call conversation, the driver and everyone else sharing that road with this person is at risk. The latest crash statistics as reported by the National Safety Council now show that distractions are contributing factors in 1 out of every 4 crashes.

DO YOU REALLY WANT TO DRIVE THIS BLINDLY?

DO YOU WANT YOUR WINGMAN, FAMILY & FRIENDS DRIVING THIS WAY?

Of course not!!! So, take responsibility and spend a moment now to reflect on your driving habits. If you allowed yourself to engage in cell-phone conversations or other non-essential activities, then make no mistake my friend- **YOU ARE AT RISK.** Make a commitment to yourself to eliminate distractions when you are driving.

Let *i*t, temptation to engage in cell conversation will always be there, but the decision and responsibility to stay safe is totally **OURS!!!**

- 1. Your membership must be current and assigned to a Colorado Chapter
- 2. Members must be enrolled in the Levels Program

- If Level I, show your intention to be level three within a short period.

- 3. Your current Medic First Aid/CPR expiration should be within 90 days, or already expired
 - Remember that Level II requires an ERC course for the rider or Co-Rider Seminar for the co-rider. Level III Requires Medic First Aid/CPR.
