MAY IS MAINTENANCE

May is Maintenance Month. Everyday before we go on a ride, do a maintenance check of the motorcycle. We should all check our motorcycles before we head out for a ride. We should at least do a T-CLOC on our motorcycle. Establish a routine that you will go through before every ride. Start by evaluating the condition of your motorcycle as you walk up to it. Do a mental T-CLOCS. Look at the tires as you approach (inflated, tread, visible damage). Are there any oily or wet spots on the ground under your bike (where did it come from, is it safe to ride)? And try to be conservative when you answer these questions to yourself. Keep your eyes open for anything amiss. Then, if everything looks okay, gear up. (Of course, you should do a physical T-CLOCS regularly, too, especially before starting a long ride!) A quick check of the motorcycle should take about a couple of minutes. I definitely check all lights and turn signals.

However, if your going to install led lights all over the motorcycle, you may want to allow for more time. Case in point...I have a friend that wants to install led lights under the saddle bags for starters. He asked me what he would need to accomplish this task. For starters, you would need a light switch, grounding block, power panel with fuses, 16/18 gauge wire and a lot of other items. What he didn't realize that the top shelter, meter panel and seat had to come off to run wires and install the light switch and other items. Keep in mind that he has not taken the motorcycle apart before and this would be a challenge. After showing him the Steve Saunders video with instruction, this seem overwhelming for him. A project this magnitude requires time and patience. That's why I work on these projects during the winter months. I can take my time and plan the routing of wires and the positioning of lights. I call this the **WINTER UPGRADES**, and that's **why I don't ride until May**.
