### WHAT'S IN YOUR SADDLEBAG?

So you know you should have a First Aid Kit in your bike when you ride. Do you know the best place to keep it? Many like to keep it in one of the side bags. Did you know the best place to keep it is actually the trunk of your Goldwing? Reason: in the event the bike should go down; where's it going to land? Yep, you can bet it's most likely going to be in the side case on whichever side you went down, and you &/or your bike may or may not be in shape to pick the bike up to get it. Also, when's the last time you inventoried your First Aid Kit? Anything need replacing? Expired items?

Other things to consider having on your bike in the event of accident or being stranded for whatever reason:

- Fire extinguisher
- Tool kit and tire repair kit
- Spare fuses
- Air pump
- Gold Book
- Owner's Manual
- Spare key
- Map
- GPS
- Cell phone
- Cash
- Rain suits

- Heated gear
- Sun block
- Hat/Cap
- Extra Gloves
- Wind screen cleaner
- Bike cover
- Siphon hose
- Snacks
- Water
- Fuel / coolant / oil
