Years ago, as Steve and I were headed home around 11:30 p.m. from our friends house, I being REALLY tired......you guessed it, I fell asleep.

As we were moving down the road, going approximately 50 mph, the front tire on our motorcycle blew out, scary, very scary! As Steve struggled to keep our bike upright, while our bike desperately tried to lay down, I slept on.....

Steve would just get it upright and it would lean way to the left....he would again get it upright and it would lean way to the right. After much effort, Steve was not only able to keep our motorcycle upright but bring our bike safely to a complete stop!

I remember Steve, with his face inches from mine, adrenaline pumping, asking me, in a louder then normal voice, ARE YOU OKAY?? I remember feeling groggy but answering that I was fine. I also remember wondering why Steve was talking so loudly and having the sensation of making many sharp turns on that trip home 😀

We as the co-riders on our motorcycles play an important role.....Not only are we the extra set of eyes and ears, an extra voice and the extra set of arms as we are traveling down the road, but we also provide a perspective of the things around us that our rider does not see. We literally have the job of enabling our rider to have a 360 degree view.

# Riding in areas that suffered Natural Disasters

Something you may NOT have thought about...

We just returned from escaping the winter, Colorado never had, this season by traveling south to Rockport, Texas, for three months.

You may recall that last August Hurricane Harvey also visited Rockport, 4 months before we arrived. This town is on the Gulf Coast, about half an hour east of Corpus Christi, Texas. Rockport is a small town of about 11K population, with old downtown area, a block from the Gulf and a quaint Harbor.

Hurricane Harvey stayed just off the coast and sucked the water away from town revealing about a hundred yards of new shore line. Storm surge did not impact Rockport as much as it could have. What happened though is that Harvey spun up about 78 Tornadoes which ravished this area (see attached pictures)

In your travels, whether it is by Bike, Trike, Truck or car, something you probably never thought about, when passing through an area hit by a major storm, is what is on the road. Sure you see large trees, mattresses, roofs, overturned buildings, etc., are easy to see, but what about nails. The Mayor in Rockport issued his own travel advisory: "Don't come here unless you have a spare tire." -- The roads were full of nails, many people suffered flat tires, and the tire shops and garages, to call for help, were closed because of the storm.

Not something I ever thought of, and Didi and I have traveled through Limon and other places on trips that were recent victims of Mother Nature's rough side.

Bottom line - I know that it is not recommended to use tire repair kits when you only have two tires, however, I think it's a good idea to keep such a kit in your travel bag in case of an emergency - it's better than being stranded. It's also a good idea to inspect the road surfaces!

MORAL OF THE STORY: When the roofs and walls come off so do the nails and many would land on the road.

#### MORE COLD COMING

Humans are not designed for cold-weather environment, so some of us need to factor more into the equations as we prepare for the winter months to come. Also keep this in mind as we ride our motorcycle in the cold weather. We need to prepare ourselves to stay warm. Believe it or not, more people suffer from dehydration during the winter months than the summer months. So in the summer months, when we feel hot we drink fluids and head to the shade or even into an airconditioned room to cool ourselves down. During the winter, with the cool or cold weather, many of us just don't feel as thirsty as they do in the summer, even though they're losing just as much fluids.

Here are a few reasons why we dehydrate quicker in the cold:

1. Every time we breathe, we lose fluids. Ever notice the condensation escaping as you walk outside or simply when you breathe? That's water leaving your body. What about when you are shoveling those 6 feet of snow drifts that is left behind by the wind storm and you're soaked with sweat? That's also water leaving your body.

2.We don't drink enough water. Your work and lifestyle will dictate how much water you should drink. For example, it is recommend that, if you work a desk job, you should be drinking roughly 6 to 8 quarts of water per day. If you job is more physical, you should be drinking about 10 to 12 quarts per day.

3.We wear extra clothing. Heavy jackets, long underwear and other pieces of warm clothing help your body conserve heat, but the added weight and layers are factors that make the body work between 10 and 40 percent harder than when in light clothing. By working harder, the body produces more sweat, contributing to fluid loss. Notice that sweat evaporates more quickly in the cold (dry) air. We often think we aren't sweating in cold, dry weather because our perspiration tends to evaporate so quickly, and this is another factor that can contribute to a diminished thirst response. So it is best to layer your clothes and take them off as you get warm.

So for those of you that ride in the winter time, be mindful that you should stay hydrated while riding, and I'm not talking about alcoholic/caffeine beverages. Dehydration may be foremost in your mind in the hot months, but you still lose moisture in winter. Cold, dry winter air can suck moisture out of you and you may not notice that you're perspiring. So stay hydrated and have fun in the winter air.

# **THE NEW 2018 GOLD WING TEST RIDE**

The new 2018 Gold Wing are at your local Honda dealership. I had the opportunity to test drive/ride a blue Gold Wing at Fay Myers on 24 March 2018. So after the training seminar, I put on my gear and met with Austin for a briefing on the operations of this fine machine. One of the biggest change that Austin pointed out was "NO CLUTCH". Say WHAT!!! Yes this model, DCT Honda's automatic Dual Clutch Transmission. With the DCT, you can shift the bike through paddle shifters on the handlebar. The motorcycle has selectable riding modes: Economy, Rain, Sport and Tour. Economy and Rain give you a softer ride, not as much power while the other two modes give you more power. He went through the radio function, electronic windshield, you can adjust the suspension on the motorcycle for single or double passenger with or without luggage. I'm still stuck on "NO CLUTCH". The motorcycle has a smaller trunk and saddlebag space and a smaller fuel tank. With all of my information, it is time to get on the road.

Before getting out on the main road, I went around the parking lot a few times to get used to the brakes and stopping without stalling. Feeling confident, I went out on the main road driving the machine in 'drive mode", which is automatic. The motorcycle was smooth. The new suspension was awesome. On the return route back to the shop, I switch back to manual mode. The shifting took a little to get used to, but with time anyone would get the hang of it. Braking without pulling in the clutch feels different. I like the passing high beam light, similar to a vehicle. I also like the keyless entry to the trunk, just push a button to open. No key for the ignition just a key fob, push button start. NICE. The new 2018 Gold Wing is rich with a lot of features and you can adjust it to your riding style and the road condition.
