### Maintenance

Every day before we go on a ride, do a maintenance check of the motorcycle? We should all check our motorcycles before we head out for a ride. We should at least do a T-CLOC on our motorcycle. Establish a routine that you will go through before every ride. Start by evaluating the condition of your motorcycle as you walk up to it. Do a mental T-CLOCS. Look at the tires as you approach (inflated, tread, visible damage).

Are there any oily or wet spots on the ground under your bike (where did it come from, is it safe to ride)? And try to be conservative when you answer these questions to yourself. Keep your eyes open for anything amiss. Then, if everything looks okay, gear up. (Of course, you should do a physical T-CLOCS regularly, too, especially before starting a long ride!)





A quick check of the motorcycle should take about a couple of minutes. I definitely check all lights and turn signals. Make sure your GL1800 is maintained and is always in safe rideable condition. Items like brake pads, spark plugs, filters, shocks, bulbs, battery, tools, bearings, oil, repair manual and much more are needed to keep your Honda GL1800 performing at its best for a long time.

However, if you're going to install led lights all over the motorcycle, you may want to allow for more time. Case in point...I have a friend that wants to install led lights under the saddle bags for starters. He asked me what he would need to accomplish this task. For starters, you would need a light switch, grounding block, power panel with fuses, 16/18 gauge wire and a lot of other items. What he didn't realize that the top shelter, meter panel and seat had to come off to run wires and install the light switch and other items. Keep in mind that he has not taken the motorcycle apart before and this would be a challenge. After showing him the Steve Saunders video with instruction, this seem overwhelming for him. A project this magnitude requires time and plan the routing of wires and the positioning of lights. I call this the WINTER UPGRADES, and that's why I don't ride until May.

#### And now you know ... THE REST OF THE STORY.



After the April Chapter meeting on such a fine day, we couldn't resist coordinating a ride to enjoy riding through the mountains. We decided to take a group ride to Cripple Creek. After him-hawing and posturing the goals were set on the destination and organized 2 groups for the 9 bikes participating. George Davis led the first group with Barney/Miyo, Don/ Jackie, and Don Benuska as Tail gunner. The second group was led by Claude/Nancy with Robbie, Dan Ehmen, Tom and Mike Wyman as Tail gunner. You couldn't ask for a better day...not too hot and not too cold. Guess even Goldilocks would of loved it!
