RIDEOLOGY By Earl Edwards

What is that? What do I do to get there? Well, a lot of members are struggling to get to the 25,000 mile plateau for Level III to Level IV. Basically, you have to ride more than you do now. Duh!! We all know that we need to ride to accomplish this task. But how? Well, I use myself as an example. I ride everyday to work, which is 25 miles one way, give or take a couple of miles depending on the route to work and just to keep math simple. So 250 miles a week, not including weekends and 1000 miles a month. I ride from May to October which is 6 months or 6000 miles. You may ride in the months of March/April or November /December but you may not wander from home due to the weather here in Colorado. (Check the Weather Channel before you leave home.)





However, the bulk of the miles comes from out of state riding to Wing Dings and long distance vacation trips. Laura and I have been as far east as Washington, DC, North/South Carolina and Michigan and as far west as Seattle, San Francisco and San Diego. Most of our trips to the east coast average about 1700 miles one way and to the west coast about 1500 miles. So that's another way to rack up the miles and have fun at the same time.

Another way to accumulate miles is to go on rides that have been set-up by the Chapter Ride Co-ordinator. The Ride Co-ordinator sets up rides with your Chapter, other Chapters, and maybe Chapters from out of state. By going on Chapter rides, you get to meet new friends, visit new and different locations in the state or out of state. This is a way to get more miles on your motorcycle. That being said, whatever method that you choose to ride to get more miles ensure that you are safe when doing so. **Remember: Keep the shiney up!**





### **THE MOLLY-DHARMA RUN STORY**



The Molly-Dharma Run (MDR) began in 2007 to benefit MaxFund, a No-Kill Animal Shelter in Denver, Colorado.

This motorcycle ride event was named for Molly-Dharma, a very large, intimidating dog, who had many issues to overcome before she could be adopted, and who was kept at MaxFund for over two and a half years before Kirk Zimmerman adopted her. Ken Mann walked Molly at MaxFund and introduced her to Kirk when she looked, and acted, like she wanted to rip him to pieces. It was touch and go in the beginning, very difficult. Kirk and Ken co-founded this event in Molly's honor for MaxFund in 2007, ... and have done this event every year since. Molly turned 12 in September of 2015, and crossed the Rainbow Bridge in 2016. R.I.P. Ms. Molly-Dharma 9/1/2003 - 8/19/2016






