FORCE OF HABIT

I found an article that relates to "muscle memory" regardless of what we do. How our brains process information, starting with perception, then reaction and decision making which requires its own time to complete.

Have you ever wondered why it is that every time you get on the aircraft, even if you've flown a hundred times before, you get a safety briefing about that particular plane? It has to do with improving survivability by harnessing habits, thereby improving the brain's response to stimuli under stress. According to scientist, the brain is "a multi-channel, limitedcapacity signal processor with built-in limitations that affects its ability to operate in a real-time emergency.



One limitation is that the brain can only hold so much information at one time. The other is that it can process information only so fast. Under optimal conditions, the human brain can take in and process new information in roughly eight to ten seconds. But stress hormones slow that response, requiring more time to process new information and lengthening reaction time...

Fortunately, our brains have a way to speed up that processing and reduce the time required for emergency responses. We draw upon habits obtained through practice. Practice converts the steps in a sequence into a simple "muscle memory" action, reducing the reaction time from eight to ten seconds down to one to two seconds. In relation to motorcycle riding, we need to ride and practice as often as possible. I realize that living in a snow state that may not always be possible. Taking Advance Riding Course or Parking Lot Courses helps build that "muscle memory". This helps build that "muscle memory" so that when the times comes to react, we can react without hesitation. Practice makes perfect.
