MOTORCYCLE INFORMATION

prings

I have gathered some information from M.O.S.T. (Motorcycle Operator Safety Training) in regards to tire care. This is one of the most critical items on your motorcycle. Time now to get tires and get ready for maintenance day.

Listed below is a list of **guidelines** for your tire care.

Motorcycle Tire Tread Depth:

- Tire depth gauge calibrated in 1/32 of an inch must be used to measure tread depths on motorcycle tires.
- Readings shall be taken in major tread grooves at five points across the width and circumference at various distances.
- A tire shall be considered fails if:
- There is less than or equal to 2/32 at any of the 5 points where the tread measurements were made.
- Any contact of a tread wear indicator constitutes tire failure.
- A localized worn spot that exposes the ply or cord through the tread

A tire that has failed will need to be replaced within 15 calendar days of that date of inspection/notification.

Motorcycle Tire Defects and criteria (physical attributes) – visual inspection

A tire shall have considered "fails" if there is/ are:

- Any cuts or puncture, in any direction, so that the fabric, ply, or cords are visible
- A cut, break, or crack which is
 - In excess of one inch in any direction as measured on the outside of the tire
- A bump, bulge, or knots related to separation
- Tire does not display appropriate Department of Transportation markings

Note: Plugs/Patches shall be in the tread area only. Plugs/patches are not permitted in the sidewall of the tire

A tire that has failed will need to be replaced within 15 calendar days of that date of inspection/notification.







RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM Continued...



Motorcycle Tire Flat Spotting

- Tire depth gauge calibrated in 1/32 of an inch must be used to measure tread depths on motorcycle tires.
- Readings shall be taken in major tread grooves at five points across the width and circumference at various distances.
- A tire must pass the 2/32 tread wear inspection in all five areas measured.

On the Motorcycle tire; when there is a variance of more than 2/32 between one point of inspection to another area of the tire then that tire is considered to have developed a flat spot.

- When a flat spot area has been confirmed that tire will be considered having failed.
- A tire that has failed will need to be replaced within 15 calendar days of that date of inspection/notification.

Motorcycle Tire Age:

A Motorcycle tire has a manufactured date stamped onto the sidewall. Example: 4510 = 45th week of 2010 DOT XX 5Y XX00 2613 DOT 2613 XX 5Y XX00 Department of Manufacturer Tire Size Manufacturer ID Number Week and Year Transportation & Plant Code Code Tire was made (Optional)

A tire mounted on a motorcycle used for the purpose of a MOST course(s) shall be considered "fails" if:

It is over eight (8) years of age from the date of the tire manufacture.

The date stamped on a motorcycle tire is no longer visible to the naked eye

A motorcycle tire that has failed must be replaced within 15 calendar days of date of inspection/ notification.

Motorcycle Tire Pressure (QA) Guidelines

Test the tire pressure when the tires are cold.

Motorcycle tires that are mounted onto a motorcycle used for the purpose of a MOST course(s) should be inflated to either of the recommended tire pressure(s):

- Stated on the Motorcycle swing arm
- Stated by the motorcycle manufacturer for that specific motorcycle make, model, and year.
 - If tire pressure is based on manufacturer guidelines vendor is required to have guidelines:
 - readily available on the range to aid the RiderCoach's ability to adjust tire pressure as needed
 - Readily available upon request by MOST

Tire Pressure of range motorcycles will be checked during a QA visit.

- If the front or rear Motorcycle tire is either over inflated or under inflated the QA team member will make note within the QA report.
- The RiderCoach/Instructor should make arrangements to get noted tire(s) into proper pressure prior to the QA team member's departure of the range.
- If the tire pressure is not adjusted prior to the QA team member's departure from the range no further action will be taken by the QA team member, except to note it within the QA report.

No follow up will be made by MOST to a vendor based on Tire pressure recommendation notes alone.



Motorcycle Tire Storage Recommendations

RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM Continued...

- Clean tires before storing
 - Use soap, water, and a tire brush to clean the tires. Wipe the tires and wheels down with a towel, then let them dry completely. Do not use tire dressing or tire gloss when storing tires.
- Inflate Tires to Correct Pressure
 - This will help to retain their proper shape.
 - If storing the motorcycle on the tires, rotate each wheel once a month to prevent flat spots.
- Seal the tires
 - Once tires are clean and dry, put them into large, dark, airtight plastic bags like lawn and garden bags. Try to remove as much air from the bags as possible before sealing them securely with tape. This will help prevent the lubricating oil within the tire compounds from evaporating.
- Unmounted Motorcycle tires should be stored upright
 - The best way to store tires is standing upright it puts less stress on the tires
 - Do not hang unmounted tires
- Mounted motorcycle tires should be stacked when stored
 - Mounted tires on the rims, hanging them from hooks is a great storage option.
- Keep tires out of the sun
 - Tires soak up the heat of the sun and can easily heat up to over 120 degrees F. This intense heat, coupled with the sun's ultraviolet rays, can cause the rubber to break down.
- Store in a well-ventilated, temperature control area with No Open Contaminants Present
 - Make sure no open chemicals are stored around the motorcycle. As these chemical fumes can speed up breakdown.
 - Try to make sure the tires are stored in a cool, dry place. Avoid storing tires outdoors, in a standard garage, or in an attic basically, any place that could be very hot, wet, humid, or cold.



CHAPTER SKILL ENHANCEMENT ADVISOR

Job Summary

The role of Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor (CSEA) is to proactively support Member/Participant by providing them with information they can consider on ways to become skilled, prepared and safer riders and co-riders.

Encouraged Responsibilities

- Serve as an example by being actively engaged in the Levels Program.
- Monthly, or as often as possible and weather permitting based on Members interest, put on an on-bike skills day with skill practice, bike games for riders and co-riders.
- Team with the Chapter Ride Coordinator to promote the importance of best riding practices at chapter gatherings, rides and events.
- Utilize the quarterly Chapter Levels Report provided by the District Educator to support the Members and assist them in achieving milestones and earning recognition.
- Communicate directly with the District Educator to advocate for classes and courses to serve any chapter participant with an interest in progressing in the levels program, becoming a more proficient rider and being better prepared to respond to emergency situations.

Qualifications and Skills

The Chapter Skill Enhancement Advisor:

- is not an officer; and the position is not mandatory.
- has a basic knowledge of the GWRRA Rider Education Program
- is appointed by the Chapter Director
- is interviewed by the District Educator
- completes a Confidentiality Agreement
- is a current Level II Rider or Co-Rider
- receives guidance and support from the District Educator
- communicates with the District Educator directly, keeping the Chapter Director in the loop to assure the needs of the chapter participants are met. Remember, the Chapter Skill Enhancement Adviser is an active participant on the Chapter staff and primary direction comes from the Chapter Director
- does not have access to the RE database and relies on the District Educator for the information.

Goal: To provide the membership with the basic support needed to participate meaningfully and successfully in the GWRRA Rider Education Program at the Chapter level.
